Profile for Pancreas 2000 PARTICIPANT

Person

MD-trained with completed undergraduate training. Candidate can be a graduate student of any kind (PhD – note: Different meanings of this in different European countries).

Candidate should be preferably a resident/intern in medicine, pediatrics or surgery. Candidate must have at least expressed an interest in the pancreas (undergraduate studies, master thesis/diploma, [German] MD thesis) OR s/he without prior experience must clearly be assigned to this by the supervisor/head of department/division. Candidate should not have completed her/his speciality training or PhD (Habilitation etc.)

Institution and supervisor/mentor

Candidate must have an identifiable supervisor who supports her/him. If this individual is not a mentor in the Pancreas 2000 programme, special care must be taken to solicit explicit support, best by the head of department/division.

The institution (department/division) must have a track record of dealing with pancreatic diseases, at least on a regional (state) level.

Framework

By investigating the surroundings of the candidate, it must be assured that s/he will have sufficient time off (clinical) duties to pursue the Pancreas 2000 project and attend all Pancreas 2000 meetings at full length. Current regulations ask for financial support by the institution for travelling to and from the location.
